

Summer day camp:

Because team work is key to a great summer for your child!

Parent's role

Ask yourself: does my child need the presence of an attendant to have a positive experience of day camp and be able to participate fully in the proposed activities?

- ⇒ If the answer is YES, contact your local day camp <u>before the end of March</u> so the organization can benefit from financial aid to hire such a resource.
- ⇒ If the answer is NO, but your child has specific needs: inform your local camp at the time of registration to ensure a positive experience.

Does your child receive professional services (medical, educational or otherwise) or have an individualized education plan?

You can authorize any professional that works with your child to inform the camp's supervisor of winning strategies that will ensure a positive and fun experience for your child this summer! Check out the authorization form at urlsgim.com under *Dossiers/Camp/Boîte à outils*.

Professional's role

- To inform families of the available activities and services to help the child participate fully.
- To help parents identify the best strategies to encourage the child's involvement: presence of an attendant, transfer of information, ad justment of equipment, professional support;
- To guide families through the registration process and the adjustment of some activities.

Camp's role

When the need for an attendant is confirmed before the end of March, start the process to obtain financial support.

Gather all information available so the child feels welcome:

If needed, hire an attendant and make sure he or she is properly trained.
